Camp Sunburst is a co-ed camp for children and young adults with special learning, physical and developmental needs. Enjoy fun-filled days while learning practical social and life skills. We offer a unique program approach which combines key elements that encourage progress: structured programming, nurturing care and a positive setting. All of our activities are instructional by design to help children make important strides in their lives. Daily activities stimulate a camper's awareness and interest in their environment and relationships, motivating them to build important foundations of self-confidence, self-efficacy, personal growth and independence. Program includes swim lessons and Friday field trip. Camp is open, but not limited to children and young adults with: Learning and Developmental Disabilities, Attention Deficit and Attention Deficit with Hyperactivity Disorders (ADD / ADHD), Autism Spectrum Disorders, Physical Disabilities and other special needs. Many of our Camp Staff work in the East Hartford Special Education system. If participant needs 1:1 staffing, arrangements must be made by you before they can participate in the program. All must be toilet trained and able to communicate their needs.

RAIN DAY PROCEDURES

Camp is held rain or shine. We try to hold the program outdoors in marginal weather. Please dress your child appropriately.

**Inclement weather days will be determined the day prior and camps will be held

ARRIVAL AND DISMISSAL

at the designated indoor locations

Campers are to be dropped off and picked up in a designated area at camp. Campers are not permitted to bring guests to the program. Campers are not permitted to bike/walk to or from camp. Parents CANNOT drop campers off in the parking lot, you must walk them in.

SIGN IN AND SIGN OUT

You will be required to sign the camper in and out daily. Have a photo ID ready to ensure a quick and easy sign out. All persons designated for pickup must be a minimum of 16 years of age and able to provide proper photo identification. (A school ID, Driver's License, State issued ID card).

DROP OFF AND PICK UP

Morning drop off time is 8:30AM and pickup is promptly at 3:30PM. Campers will not be permitted to be dropped off or signed in until 8:30AM. Unless doing extended care.

1st occurrence: Warning

2nd occurrence: \$5.00 late fee will be assessed any time after 3:30PM for every 15 minutes late. Unless doing extended care. Campers ARE NOT permitted to return to camp until fee has been paid.

3rd occurrence: Meet with Camps Director

DAILY SCHEDULE

We offer varied activities in arts and crafts, music, sports, games, swimming, field trips and special events. Please let staff know if your child will be absent on a particular day. No camp July 4th.

Registration

Participant must be registered by Thursday 4:30 PM for the upcoming week of camp. If a child is not registered for camp they can not be dropped off at camp.

SUNSCREEN

Please apply sunscreen to your child prior to coming to camp and remember to send them with waterproof sunscreen, SPF 30 or higher. Staff is **NOT PERMITTED** to apply sunscreen to campers so sending them with spray sunscreen works best. There are mandatory sunscreen breaks throughout the day that will give children ample opportunity to reapply.

SWIMMING

Swim times may be offered as a complimentary service at all camps. Certified American Red Cross Lifeguards are on duty at all times during swim times and camp staff provide additional supervision. Campers will receive swim instruction during morning swim. Refunds are not given for cancelled swim times.

SPECIAL EVENTS, FIELD TRIPS AND T-SHIRTS

Participants enjoy special events and trips at various times throughout the summer. Trips are offered using school bus transportation. Campers must wear their camp T-shirt that is provided for them. In the event that a camper is not wearing their T-shirt, the parent/guardian that has signed the child in will be required to purchase a T-shirt for \$10.00. Parents are not permitted to send their child on field trips without a camp shirt. We will do our best to accommodate sizes.

NOTICES AND FLYERS

If the participant leaves early or will be away from the program for a period of time, check with a staff member for information about upcoming trips and other events or activities you may not want to miss. A weekly newsletter will be emailed to parents.

WHAT TO BRING

All participants should bring plenty of water, hat or visor, bathing suit, towel, sunscreen, a lunch and two healthy snacks every day. Be sure to label all of their belongings and put in a backpack. Remember, children will be carrying their backpacks with them throughout the day so keep things light! No cell phones, electronics or valuables are permitted.

REFUND POLICY

Due to limited space in our programs, refunds, upon receipt of a doctor's note, one week prior to the program's start. Once a program has begun, no refunds are given unless there is a case of a medical emergency with submission of a doctor's note. Extenuating circumstances, which are not medical in nature, will be reviews on a case-by-case basis. Refunds will not be given for any reasons for sessions which have already been completed. A 10% processing fee will be charged on all refunds or program transfers regardless of reason. Your request will be processed in 7 - 10 business days.

BEHAVIOR EXPECTATIONS

Participants whose behavior interferes with a safe, positive experience for others and the environment may be subject to dismissal. The discipline procedure is as follows:

Stage One: Discussions with the parent/ guardian regarding behavior. Reports may be written up.

Stage Two: Participant may be sent home for remainder of the day and will be suspended from the program for the following day without reimbursement.

Stage Three: Participant will be sent home for the remainder of the day and suspended for one week's time without reimbursement.

Stage Four: Dismissal from the program without reimbursement.

The Parks & Recreation Department may use discretion in the disciplinary process. Our staff will work with the parent/ guardian and child to make every effort to promote positive behaviors. Those who engage in behavior that is deemed to be unsafe to themselves or others may be asked to leave the camp program. Parents will be required to pick up the child in the event of a behavior incident that puts the camp/child at risk. Parents/Guardian will be responsible for finding supervision for their child should they be dismissed from camp.
